December 5, 2009 – 7:00 pm Time Out

- I. Don Evers called the meeting to order.
- II. Treasurer's Report – Edwin gave a complete breakdown of financial activities for November to include income and disbursements for the month. Edwin further reported that thanks to the hard work of the committees, all of the events were a success in 2009. Don also thanked the members for providing their support at the events this year and asked that they support their new board in 2010.
- III. Committee Reports
 - a. Membership Committee – Our membership total is 165.
- IV. Upcoming Events
 - Don reported that the Christmas Party is set for Saturday, December 19th. The party venue includes a sit down dinner buffet that will include steak, chicken, two vegetables, dessert, and tea. Chigger Woods and Jerry Burrage will DJ the event together. There has been approximately 100 people who have RSVP'd so everyone is encouraged to come out and have a great time. Everyone is also reminded to bring paper goods for Ronald McDonald.

EBSC Minutes
January 23, 2010 – 7:00 pm Time Out

Steve called the meeting to order and asked Rick to preside over the meeting.

Ed gave the treasurer's report through the end of 2009. An account of the costs for the Christmas Party and New Year's Party were given and a comparison was given from last year. It was mentioned the nice set down dinner this year that included 2 meats, vegetables, bread, desserts and beverages.

Cookie Woods gave the membership count as of the meeting being 161 members.

Sharon Hardrick announced the Sunshine Committee sent a card to Linda Bivins for the death of her cousin.

The Float Committee was announced with the committee consisting of Bill and Cindy Atkins (new members) as well as Barry & JoEllen Yeargan assisting on the committee. Cindy announced they may need some help and guidance for the "Sweet Sixteen" being the theme for the float. She has been looking for ideas for the parade, ex., A Mardi Gra theme and make a big cake and have a frog to come out of the cake with real Mardi Gra masks and something that would be lively and fun.

The new Sales and Advertising will be Gene Pope – He will be taking orders for short sleeve and long sleeve t-shirts. Rick asked anyone wanting to place an order to see Nancy Pope in Gene's absence. The short sleeve t-shirts will be \$20 and the long sleeve t-shirts will be \$22. The requested Thunderbird shirt emblem will be coming back and Firehead Sports will be doing the shirts. If they scan the emblem from a t-shirt then there will be no extra charge to the club.

Rick and Linda attended the Mid-Winter ACSC mandatory meeting in January and it was mentioned there have been problems with the licensing of music that is played in a paid event. ASCA will now charge for every song the DJ plays if reported by an observer. Only paying events – Christmas Party (members free, but guests are charged), New Years' Party, annual Dance Contest. ACSC reported that ASCAP has been harassing the Jacksonville, Florida Club and has charged them \$3500 for playing non registered music without a license. It has been estimated they charge somewhere in the neighborhood of \$1 for person per song. There are three different listings of establishments that will fine you for playing music without a license at a paying event, but ASCAP is the one that will charge the most. ACSC has an attorney that is investigating this further and will have a solution hopefully by the Mid-Winter Workshop in Mooresville and will come up with one price for all clubs that the ACSC will handle the fees, but will need an account from each club as to how many events are being charged for entry and how many people attend each of those events. Eldridge Meeler said the DJ's questions are still being answered from the ACSC Board.

Rick mentioned the club renting a dance floor every time there was an event in the banquet room and being charged \$300 per time to rent. Nancy Pope found an 18x18 Oak Parquet floor on Craig's List in Asheville that has been used 10 times and was for sale on the listing for \$600. Rick asked for a motion to purchase the floor upon it being in good condition. Sharon made the motion and Chigger seconded and it was approved by the members to purchase the dance floor. The next question was after the floor was purchased where would it be stored? For now, Nancy Pope said it could be stored in their garage until storage is resolved. Nancy suggested the club find a u-haul trailer to pull the dance floor from one place to another.

Reflecting back to Ed's Treasurer's report, David Lutz said the club was not to go into a new year having more than \$1500 balance and we have more than that totaling in the bank. Rick stated according the IRS the club could carry up to \$25,000 over from one year to the next without being penalized.

There was a question regarding the re-up membership and that it was in the bi-laws they had to be renewed by March 1st, but Cheryl said we extended it 30 days to give people until March 31st to renew their membership.

Rick mentioned ideas are needed for a fund raiser between January to April – Maybe a garage sale or yard sale. It was suggested to ask Eddie at Time Out Sports Bar if we could use his parking lot for this kind of fund raiser.

Cheryl will put together the Re-Up and Area Parties and will be extending an invitation for help in planning both events. Rick asked Susan Evers if she would continue in 2010 to be the Chair of the Dance Contest and Susan agreed.

Rick asked Chigger Woods if he would be Chair of Fun Monday once again and he agreed.

Rick said if anyone were interested in being on the Golf Tournament planning to please let him know.

A Greeting Committee and Half & Half Committee sign up sheets were passed around for sign up at each 1st and 3rd Saturday meeting/dance for 2010.

Rick brought up that he and Linda attended a Coalition meeting with the other 5 clubs after the ACSC meeting. Eno Beach and Winston Salem will host the Coalition on the beach at Fall SOS. A question was raised as to what the Coalition party was and Rick gave a summary of what the six clubs had done in the past for a fun event on the beach. We asked the club their thoughts on a low country boil that was brought up at the meeting at SOS and no one made a motion to accept.

Dewey Davis mentioned the name tags and how important it was to wear them and be recognized and he still had name tags that people haven't picked up to date. He also mentioned the idea of a storage place needed and he appreciated all that the board has done. He mentioned how great it was to see the new members to take part in the club and be active.

Sharon Hardrick mentioned it would be a good idea to place something on the single ladies' name tags indicating they were available to dance and the men (married or not) could indicate something on their name tags saying they would be willing to dance with them.

Rick thanked everyone again for their support. Steve asked if there was any further business and there was a motion to adjourn. After the motion was made and approved the meeting was adjourned.

Our thoughts and prayers are extended to those that are sick and to the members who have lost a loved one.

Thank you Bev for writing such an interesting background of EBSC. Beverly will have a copy of a booklet on the beginning of the club this Saturday night (February 6) for everyone to view.

I was asked to write some memories of the early days of EBSC. Alan & I met in 1983 at Bananas at the Ramada Inn on Guess Rd. (where there's now a Red Roof Inn) where we went to dance, along with Nancy Keen Pope, Janice Ellis, Donnie Hodnett, Larry Castle, and Phyllis McCubbins, among others. We loved to dance and were pleased when Chigger Woods told us about forming a new shag club in December of 1989, which met at Howard Johnson's with Patsy Edgerton and Sam Way presiding, Donnie Hodnett teaching the Boss (line dance), and 1/2 and 1/2 being introduced.

By January, 1990 we had 120 members and Jerry and Kay Burrage were teaching shag lessons.

February 1990 was a memorable month as J.D. Cash had made and began selling beach music tapes, Donnie taught the Tush Push, and EBSC applied for a charter by the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs. Alan and I got married on Valentine's Day and we began our tradition of celebrating our anniversaries with the Capital Area Shag Club at its Winter Beach Blast at the Sheraton in Atlantic Beach. I won the 1/2 and 1/2 at our meeting that month which we considered a good omen.

By March membership rose to 158 and we had a party at In the Raw on Guess Road which became our meeting place, thanks to Crafton and Lynda Mitchell, owners.

In April Alan and I finally had a honeymoon at Spring SOS. At the Fall 1989 SOS there was a contest to find the Genie in the Bottle at one of the participating clubs and I found it at the Spanish Galleon. The finder had to bring it to Phil Sawyer at the OD Cafe across the street and present the (then paper, not plastic) SOS membership card to win the Grand Prize of a free week at the Tilghman for Spring SOS. I nearly panicked when a gust of wind blew my card out of my hand as we crossed Ocean Blvd. Luckily I found it in some weeds at the edge of the parking lot and the rest is history. Our picture appeared in the SOS Times, but Phil didn't write down Alan's first name so the caption read "Stan" Rodgers. Phil said he could see from Alan's name badge that it was 4 letters ending in "an" so he decided it must be Stan.

Patsy and Sam resigned in May to relocate to Myrtle Beach and Chigger Woods and Kenny Parker took over as President and Vice President.

Many activities took place the rest of the year including acceptance of our charter, a giant yard sale raising \$335 for charity, our first Christmas Party at Willowhaven, and membership increased to 192. A Reviews and Highlights booklet of our first year was presented to members at the party which refreshed my memories.

The friendships we forged during these past 20 years have sustained me through Alan's illness and death, and I will forever be grateful for my wonderful friends and "cheerleaders".

Cindy Atkins (new member of EBSC) was asked to write an article on her path with cancer. For those that know Cindy and Bill you will be touched with this story because they are loved so much by our shag club, great friends and are very involved. Cindy, thank you for sharing your awesome story with us.

Everyone has a story to tell when it comes to cancer. Whether it is a family member, a spouse, a friend, or you – cancer affects everyone in some way shape or form. I was asked to tell you my story, which is no more unique than yours, but in any case, it has affected my husband, my daughters, my grandchildren, my parents, my sisters and brother, my friends , ----my life! This is my journey, and a journey it has been.

I was working as a fire technician (driver) on Engine #2 at Station #2 on Ninth Street. I loved my job and the people I worked with. I was close to beginning my 11th year with the fire department when I got the news regarding the results of a biopsy that was done on a lump found on my right breast. I remember that day like it was yesterday – February 6th, 2008. I was told that I had breast cancer, although the extent of it was not determined until I got a second opinion at Duke Comprehensive Breast Cancer Clinic. After a PET scan, bone scan, breast MRI, probing of my lymph nodes, and additional biopsies, the final results were in. I had Stage IV metastatic breast cancer. Not only was it in my breast, it was also found in my liver and my spine. I started chemotherapy the next day! The doctor told me that my cancer could not be cured, but it could be controlled. I went through 10 months of chemotherapy. My husband Bill was always by my side and never missed a treatment! I lost all my hair, eyelashes, and eyebrows. Other than fatigue and neuropathy in my fingers and toes, I had no other side effects. I decided to see if blondes have more fun and borrowed a cute strawberry blonde wig from the Butterfly Boutique, otherwise known as the Self- Image room at Duke. My nickname was Goldie around the Morris Clinic. I changed wigs after 6 months and went for a “Linda Evans” look. I got a lot of compliments on my hair and I now can say that blondes really do have more fun! Anyway, my fire department brothers and sisters worked my shift for me for about 3 months, so I would not use all my sick time. Although, when the doctor told me that I would be on indefinite chemotherapy and could not be a firefighter anymore, I started the process of disability retirement. I tried to go back to work as the Fire Services Officer, an administrative position, but found the demands to be too much for me, since I was still going through chemotherapy. At the recommendation of my doctor and insistence of my husband, I decided to stop working and go forward with my retirement. This was very difficult for me, because I loved my job and even though I could not be a firefighter anymore, I still wanted to be a part of the fire department. To be quite honest with you, it was more devastating for me to leave my career in the fire department than having cancer. You have to understand that the fire department was my family away from my own family. They were my biggest supporters, for they would visit me every Friday in the Clinic when I was having chemotherapy and would visit me at home. As a matter of fact, a couple of my colleagues put together a wonderful motorcycle poker run to help raise money for me and my treatments. This amazing event raised \$13,000.00. I am still humbled by all the love and support that was shown to me that day! I started my career late in life and worked hard to be the best I could be --- now it was being taken away from me. Cancer was changing my life!

During the course of my treatment, I became a part of the Pathfinders Research Support Program which only consisted of women with Stage IV metastatic breast cancer. That was such a blessing to me and my husband because it gave us an outlet to be able to vent our feelings, deal with our emotions and fears, and talk to others that have the same disease. It gave us the tools to move forward and face each day with hope! It allowed me to see that I can live with cancer and have years of a full life!

When I first got the news of my disease, I can honestly say that there was a peace inside of me that took over. Bill had a harder time facing the fear of losing his wife and he became very

angry at God and the world! He could not understand why me----- why not someone else who was more deserving of it. Well, why not me! My faith, in God above, has given me the strength and the peace through my Lord Jesus Christ to get through this difficult time. There is a reason why I am going through all of this—I do not know what it is, but I trust that He does. I can tell you that I have been through an amazing journey and I would not change a thing! Which I am sure comes as a surprise to you. There is always something good that comes from something bad – sometimes you have to look really hard to find the good, but it is there! I have experienced so many blessings through this journey. I have met so many wonderful people that I otherwise would not have met. I have been involved in so many events and activities that have been so rewarding and inspiring. When you are faced with a situation like this you can either let it consume your life and make you miserable or you can grow from it emotionally, mentally, and more importantly, spiritually. Whether someone has touched my life or I have touched their life in some way, the journey has been absolutely incredible! God is in control and His presence is evident every day in my life! My scans have been clear for a year now and I give Him all the praise and glory. I still get treatment every 3 weeks specific to my cancer to try to keep it under control, but it is not chemotherapy. I work 2 days a week as a volunteer at Duke Morris Cancer Clinic in the Self Image room. It is the same place that I got my wigs and it was such a wonderful experience for me that I wanted to do the same for someone else. There is nothing more rewarding than to help put a smile on someone's face when they need it the most during a difficult time. It is amazing to see what a wig can do for someone who has no hair. You can watch their demeanor change before your eyes, because they feel so much better about themselves. I know ----- I have been there! That is why I love what I do! I have the opportunity to help others, to share God's love and grace, and give them hope!

Lastly, I must not forget to mention that my husband and I would probably not be taking shag lessons if it wasn't for my cancer. I know that it was something he did it for me, because he knew how much I wanted to learn to shag. And now look at all the wonderful people we have met, since we started lessons with Gene and Nancy and joined the Eno Beach Shag Club. We are having a great time and we enjoy it so much! So you see, there is always something good that comes from something bad! And as long as I can, I will live my life and enjoy every day the best way I know how ----- “shagging on the boulevard”!

Thank you for being a part of my story. I still have many more years to tell it!

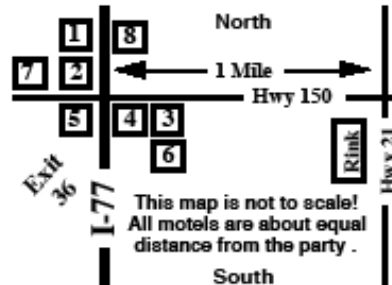
