EBSC Minutes
June 5, 2010 – 7:00 pm @ Time Out
Reported by Linda Bivins, Secretary

Rick called the meeting to order and gave a moment of silence for Bettie Hall Boring who died in a car crash recently. Her son, Scott, is starting a bereavement fund for Bettie if anyone would like to donate.

Ed gave the treasurer's report and said to account for the expense of the trailer cost of \$2800 plus the expense of gas traveling to pick up the trailer. This would be on next month's financial report.

Rick said the trailer was outside and encouraged everyone to go take a look at their investment. The person we purchased it from had lowered the price of trailer from \$3900 to \$3100 and we offered him \$2800. The club budgeted for \$2500 and \$300 was brought before the club for approval of the final cost of the trailer, plus \$80 for gas expenses to pull the trailer. Rick said the trailer had no dents and was in good shape. A motion was made and seconded by the members.

A motion was made and approved to give Ronald McDonald House their check in the amount of \$1000.

David Lutz gave the membership report of 165 members as of May 17, 2010. EBSC had 124 re-ups and 34 new members.

Rick announced that it was good to see Donnie Hodnett in the club with us that night.

Judy Adcock gave the Sunshine report and said flowers were sent to Tonya on behalf of her surgery and flowers were sent to the Tyrees.

Susan Evers, Chair of the Dance Contest stated the interest in the contest was the same as last year and more sponsorship was expected.

Rick said if anyone planned to attend the Burlington Luau in June to let Linda know so the final headcount can be given to reserve tables.

Shaggin' into Summer is on June 18. Rick said to let Linda know if you would like to go so advanced tickets can be purchased and also if anyone would be interested in selling 50/50 tickets.

Rick said in the last meeting we had someone from Raleigh Shag Club to ask if anyone would be interested in buying silk shirts with our logo. The original logo is dancing frogs and with Thunderbird. The other logo is a frog standing next to the juke box. It would cost \$55 for one logo with one color (any color you want). It would cost more with more

colors. Dewey Davis said his preference would be the Thunderbird. The majority of the members voted to have the Thunderbird logo with the jukebox and frog.

David Lutz asked that the treasurer's report be amended from the last meeting. He mentioned \$200 from the winnings of the Spring SOS Float was given back to SOS for their charity. The question comes why the money wasn't reported to the membership in Ed's treasurer report and then the board saying it was a wash. There is a requirement to report to IRS and if not reported to IRS there is a \$2500 requirement. David stated in the past a member did scoundrel money out of our club of \$1200. The money wasn't accounted for and Chigger stepped in to check on the money and where the money went out and to make sure the board didn't pick up on the money. David made a recommendation to account for money coming in and out, as well as the board checking all statements, so we know the actual spending and receiving of money coming into the club and deposit \$200 from the win of the float and it should be notated in the next report. It was later mentioned it was \$100 the club won from the parade.

Don Rust said the decision was made to turn the money back in to the charity that afternoon. We never accepted money to the club to give to the charity. Dewey and Ed filed taxes for 2009. Dewey said we agreed to give the money to charity and never received money from SOS. David asked that a motion be made for an amendment of the money received of the parade float money, since it was not shown on EBSC's records indicating the money was given to the charity at SOS. Dewey said we're supposed to trust the treasurer, since we're not bonded. He said Ed was tight with the money and he isn't giving any doubt to Ed in misuse of funds. Ed said he would never take one dime from this club and the club has grown. Cookie said maybe we could check with the other clubs on how they handle the clubs being audited.

Judy made a motion to give \$25 toward Bettie Boring's bereavement and Ed said the board would like to give \$50 and it was seconded and approved.

No other business was stated.

July 17, 2010 – 7:00 pm @ Time Out

Due to some members questioning why we need to meet each month, Rick opened the meeting stating it is a rule of the A.C.S.C. for a meeting each month. He stated we have been questioned why we need to meet each month.

Rick also stated he was glad to see some people at the meeting that we haven't seen in a while.

Ed Williams gave the Treasurer's report stating he has received \$3700 from Tiffany, dance committee co-coordinator, for sponsorship money collected for the EBSC Dance Contest in August.

Rick stated the dance committee is working hard and stressed that everyone to purchase their seats if they haven't already and they will be sure to see some good dancing. He also said there were 41 dancers last year and when we went to Salisbury several wks ago there were 39 couples. Rick and Linda spoke to several that said they will be at Eno in August for the contest, even newcomers that want to dance. Gene and Nancy are working to get the Junior Dance team to come dance on Saturday evening. More updates to come soon. David Lutz gave the Membership Report stating 165, the same as last month's meeting. He said the annual raffle raises a significant amount of money around the time of the dance contest. He stated last year there was \$1100 raised. David gave out some tickets tonight, but will mail others that were not there on the following Monday of this meeting. He asked that everyone buy or sell 10 tickets per person. Rick said the raffle is a \$500 cash award and the person that sells the most tickets gets \$100. Rick said to see David if anyone needs to receive tickets.

Ed is trying to get up with Mike Smith regarding a fund to give money to Mickey Tezai, due to the recent death of his daughter. It would be given to the EMS Service and thought that would be the most sensible thing to do, since this is the kind of work he does. Rick stated there was no one at the meeting from dance committee to give a report. He asked that everyone look at the sign up sheets up front. He talked about the raffle of the cooler that will be filled with beach items. He said if you don't buy a seat at a table then there are \$10 seats in the back of the room both nights. Rick said he and Linda have been to several contest this year and the one thing they have noticed is the big welcome they receive from the other clubs. There will be a greeter sheet for everyone to sign up for both nights.

Gene Pope has been working on the T-Shirts with dancing frogs on the front and the Thunderbird logo on the back. Once we get a certain number then he will order them. Linda and I went to the required meeting of the Fayetteville Summer Workshop this past Saturday and Ken Akin was voted in as the new Chairman of A.C.S.C. SOS's attorney

stressed that all clubs keep everything low profile with our advertisements on our websites, because ASCAP is looking for big events to check out, so be careful and keep the music off the club's websites for now as well as limiting advertisements of big events..

It would cost \$26.40 per person per year to pay ASCAP, but A.C.S.C. would pick up part of it and the clubs would pick up the other part. Wade Winstead asked Rick to inform him more about ASCAP. Rick said that ASCAP is a music industry. Royalties off of music (they want). Band license, elevator music and we're under DJ and band music. Jacksonville Shag Club is under investigation and their bill is up to \$70,000 of what they owe ASCAP. Linda said for everyone to watch out for anyone that may be writing down anything and if you don't know them to let Rick know. Butch Ennis asked if this was just for paid events and Rick said the bar is making money off us and that is still a fee being charged by Timeout. SOS has to pay their ASCAP fees due from SOS. Jim Quick and Craig Woolard have their ASCAP license. Eldridge had his license removed and was suppose to be activated this October, but will not renew. The question was asked if it was certain artists and it was told that it is all artists.

Last year on Fun Monday our hotdog stand was in front of the golf packages service. S.O.S. said the management asked there not be anything in front of the store this year. On Fun Sunday S.O.S. stated that no one should park in between the Arcade and Pirates Cove in the dirt parking lot and leave their vehicle/golf cart after 12:00 midnight or before 6:00 AM Sunday morning, due to the bands being set up for Fun Sunday or your vehicle/golf cart would be removed by the local officials.

Rick said the DJ tonight will be Mike Harding of Greensboro. Ask him to play your favorite song.

Steve Harden made a motion for the meeting to be adjourned.
